Thank you for your interest in Ohel Chana, Melbourne Australia. Ohel Chana's main aim is for you and your fellow students to have a wonderful year, which will further your growth in yiras shamayim, chassidishkeit and limud haTorah and help formulate your outlook and direction in life.

When a student comes to Ohel Chana it is assumed that she is here of her own volition and has come for a year of serious learning, creating an atmosphere of sincerity and diligence throughout the day.

In addition to maintaining a high academic standard, students must keep in mind the expectations of them in Melbourne, a city with a Beth Rivkah of 800 students from preschool to Year 12. Beth Rivkah students regard a girl who attends Ohel Chana as a living example of a chassidishe girl. Ohel Chana students have a great influence on these schoolgirls both directly and indirectly. They also help in setting the standard of tznius for all the Beth Rivkah students. It is therefore imperative that Ohel Chana students reflect the highest standard of tznius in attitude, dress and conduct.

ACADEMIC

The learning ethic must be of top priority. There are approximately 7 hours of classes each day Monday through Thursday, half-day Friday and evening classes on Sunday.

Students are expected to be punctual and prepared for all classes. Unexcused absences and tardiness will be reflected on the students' transcripts and may result in the student not receiving her Diploma, at the discretion of the Hanhala. Blatant cases of misbehavior and deliberate flaunting of Ohel Chana rules may result in the student being requested to leave the seminary.

Shabbatons, excursions and other exciting activities are also part of the program.

ACCOMMODATION

Full accommodation and all meals are provided on the premises. The cost of accommodation is included in the fees charged.

SHLICHUS/HAFOTZAH WORK

In expanding the spiritual growth and breadth of experience of the student in preparation for their future shlichus, they have the opportunity to become involved in:

Yomim Tovim

Students have the option on Yomim Tovim to go to different shluchim to help with programs in their Chabad Houses and shules. Arrangements must be made with the permission of the Hanhala. Parental permission is also necessary for girls traveling out of town.

Bnos

Our students are expected to be involved with the Beth Rivkah girls during the week; (e.g. shiurim, activities, lunchtime and after school visits, newspaper etc.). This is in addition to the Bnos groups on shabbos. Ohel Chana students will come to realize that they have a large responsibility to the school students through being a living example of a chassidishe girl in dress, activities and personal behaviour

Camp

During the summer holidays, students are strongly encouraged to be involved in the planning and running of B'nos activities and Gan Israel Camp. They can participate in the camp programs as

madrichot, giving shiurim to the students during camp and other areas of responsibility as well.

We encourage students to participate in other optional peulos:

- a) The students have the opportunity to work in a “Sunday School” environment with students from other communities through either United Jewish Education Board or Talmud Torahs at Chabad houses or local shules.
- b) Ohel Chana girls are involved in other hafotzah work such as mitzvot, hospital visits, etc
- c) Opportunities are also available for Ohel Chana girls to help families in need of extra support in the home.
